South Malahat 4-H Auction

This year, the South Malahat 4-H Auction includes projects from beef, swine and lamb members. For 4-H members, the auction represents the culmination of their year in 4-H. They look forward to your support and rely on the income to help pay for the costs as it relates to their projects and at the same time they learn marketing techniques. This also provides a unique opportunity to mix and mingle with business people.

The South Malahat 4-H Auction will be held
September 2, 2019 at 2:30 pm
in the beef show ring.

The lambs, steers and hogs will be sold by the pound live weight. The additional costs to the buyer includes the government-certified processing plant's kill fee, the transportation of the carcass to the butcher, cutting and wrapping of the meat are payable by you, the purchaser. You will be asked to provide specific cutting instructions to the butcher.

Immediately after the auction, we require a photo taken of you with the 4-H member and their animal. You will receive a copy of this picture along with a personal recognition for your contribution from the 4-H member. As well, a full-page thank-you ad will be in the Times Colonist, advertising your support of the program and its' members.

Your investment in 4-H will not only provide you with the best of the best locally raised meat, but you are also supporting young future farmers.

What is 4-H?

- 4-H is a national, non-profit organization for youth that are 6 to 21 years old.
- Aimed at assisting personal development, the 4-H program teaches skills in the areas of public speaking, leadership, community involvement and general livestock knowledge.
- As an educational program, their projects are actually a means to an end in youth development as project work helps to develop skills such as goal setting, record keeping and project management.
- 4-H helps shape members attitudes, abilities and understanding to better able them to work with others.
- It develops confidence, pride, loyalty and independence. Each skill, opportunity and award is a new experience that challenges young people to do their personal best.

The overall goal of the 4-H program is Youth Development, by providing knowledge enhancement, leadership skills, citizenship training and personal development.

FAQ

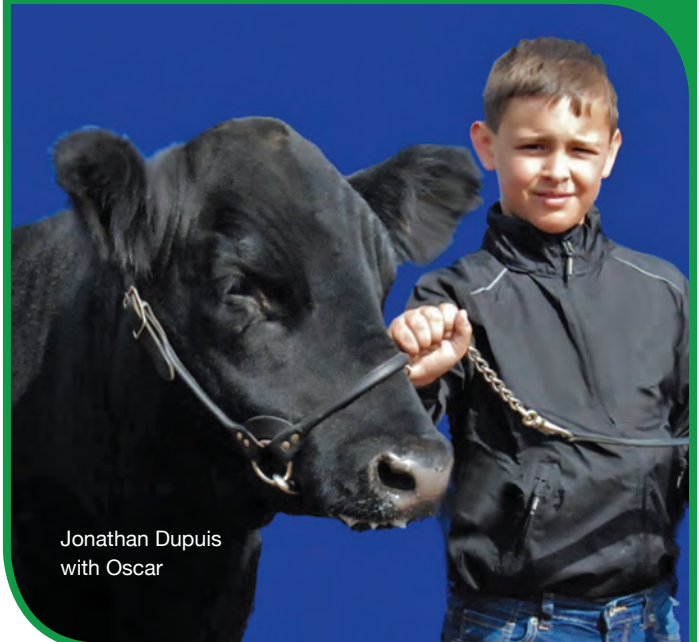
What does live weight mean? Live weight is the weight of the animal as it is standing live. Animals are weighed on the first day of the fair to get their sale weight.

How much will an animal yield? On average an animal will yield 50 – 60%. This means once processed and the hide, head, hooves and offal are removed a warm carcass weight is taken and this will determine approximately how much meat you will get with bone. For example, a 1200 lb steer (live weight) once processed would weigh between 600 – 720 lbs warm carcass weight.

What do I do if I can't attend the auction? If you are unable to make it, prior arrangements can be made with an Auction Representative to act on your behalf. Complete Auction Reserve Bid & Bill of Sale agreement.

What if I'm interested in half of an animal? Contact the Auction Committee to get yourself registered on the buyer's list and we will try and match you up with another business or family.

Can my business be invoiced? Yes, businesses can be invoiced after the sale but we require you to make arrangements with the cashier on site.
